

2011 NCAFA PeeWee All-Star Game played at Keith Harris Stadium, Carleton University

After only three practices in which to prepare for the game, the East All-Stars Offense came out firing. Running Back Dan Obiang, blasted past the line of scrimmage on his way to a 61 yard touchdown in the first quarter. Soon after, Quarterback Dimitri Morand connected with Nick Renaud for a 40 yard touchdown pass. Running Back Neville Galimor had a terrific first half, with many spectacular rushes breaking tackles and showing his great moves. Before halftime, Dan Obiang once again scored after making a very nice catch followed by a great move to avoid a tackle. Unfortunately, there was a flag on the play and it was called back and the gain limited to 30 yards. Obiang made up for it in the third quarter with an 80 yard run for a touchdown. Not to be outdone, Neville Galimor drove in to the end-zone with a 2 yard run. The East All-Stars scored once again on a touchdown by Jonathan Sutherland. Dan Obiang had a perfect day on the Point After Touchdown attempts, converting all five touchdowns. Quarterback Dimitri Morand had a great game at Quarterback showing his excellent arm and great vision of the field. The East Defense did its job as well with Rakim Brooks having both a forced fumble and a fumble recovery, along with a fumble recovery from Gates Harding and an interception by Zach Mann all in the second quarter. The rest of the East Defense had strong performances as well particularly by John Norbet, Abed Hamidi , Mostafi Kari, Maroun Beaino and Kevin Dupuis.

The game award for the East MVP went to Dan Obiang from South Gloucester Raiders, the Offensive Player of the Game to Neville Gallimor from the South Ottawa Mustangs, and the Defensive Player of the Game to Rakim Brooks from the North Gloucester Giants. Special mention has to go to Dimitri Morand from the Gatineau Vikings for his exceptional game.

The West All-Stars saw some strong performances as well, but on this day could not match the play execution of the East All-Stars. Joey McKiernan was a standout for the West both in rushing the ball and receiving passes. He was involved in the play throughout the entire game and was a threat each time he touched the ball. Steven Handzidiakou showed his skill throughout the game and had some excellent runs. The West All-Stars showed they could drive down the field, but ran into trouble with turnovers and some great plays by the East Defense. Andrew Akinniyi scored a 1 yard touchdown, and Dylan Makinson proceeded to kick the convert. Quarterback Quinn Steward completed some nice passes as did Quarterback Malik Sauve-Mohammed. Both showed poise and awareness and were able to scramble out of trouble when pressured. The West Defense shone at times, led by DB's Logan Souliere, Hava Hauthanglian and Noah Potter, Defensive Linemen Brandon Whiteman and Jacob Feraco, and Linebacker Tremayne Rockburn. They put pressure on the East Quarterbacks, made some remarkable tackles and had some exceptional plays in breaking up passes.

Joey McKiernan from Kanata Knights won the Game MVP for the West All-Stars, Steven Hanzidiakou from Bell Warriors won the West Offensive Player of the Game, and Logan Souliere from Myers Riders won the West Defensive Player of the Game.

2011 NCAFA Bantam All-Star Game played at Keith Harris Stadium, Carleton University

Quarterback Costa Jones of the Myers Riders went all the way at Quarterback for the West All-Stars and found some great chemistry throughout the game with SlotBack Jaegar Prot of the West Carleton Wolverines. Jones spread the ball around, striking early with Enzo Trunzo on a 42 yard pass and run. Trunzo was forced out on a close play at the 8 yard line, and the drive was capped by a 2 yard touchdown run by Brad Hills. The combination of Costa Jones and Jaegar Prot struck for a 65 yard touchdown on a beautiful play. The snap on the Point After Touchdown attempt was bobbled and a good heads up play resulted in a pass into the endzone. Prot followed that up with a terrific run that led to a John Allarie punt into the end-zone for a single point. Enzo Trunzo caught a 22 yard pass for a touchdown, followed by a nice run by Costa Jones for a touchdown on a Quarterback bootleg. The West rounded out their first half scoring with another great pass from Costa Jones to Jaegar Prot for a 22 yard touchdown. They picked up where they left off and started the third quarter with a 42 yard pass to Jaegar Prot who made a great move to break a tackle and extend the gain. Stephano Napolitano scored a touchdown on a strong run followed by Jahdel Ferron's touchdown and a final touchdown by Brad Herbst, who is normally a LineBacker for the West Carleton Wolverines. Napolitano had a number of nice runs and Wide Receiver Cody McLeod had a number of very nice receptions throughout the game. Special mention has to be made of the West's Offensive Line who did a terrific job of protecting their quarterback and giving him plenty of time to throw the ball.

The West Defense had a very strong game and created a stone wall that the East could not penetrate other than a few times. Kyrique Fletcher had a great game for the West, along with Filip Buljan, Jordan Gorgichuk and Ethan Goulet. Connor Guitard of the Bel-Air Lions had a very strong game. The Defense would bend but not break and would snuff out drives by the East throughout the game.

West's Game MVP was Jaegar Prot, the Offensive Player of the game was Costa Jones and the Defensive Player of the game was Jordan Gorgichuk.

The East Bantam All-Stars Offense centred around Quarterback Michael O'Connor and Wide Receiver Quinton Soares. O'Connor had some excellent rushes for close to 100 yards in the game, along with a beautiful pass to Soares for a 12 yard touchdown. Good heads-up play and great field vision allowed O'Connor to work the entire field, but the defensive coverage proved to be too strong and took away most of the opportunities. Soares seemed to be everywhere during the game and was instrumental in a large percentage of the plays. He was on the verge of breaking it open on many occasions. Tunde Adeleke showed his tremendous running ability with speeds, sharp cuts and changes of directions, but it seemed that the West's Defense focused on him all day and

every time he'd break the first few tackles there was another group of defenders waiting for him. Aiden Cote-Lapointe had a very strong game at Running Back as well, along with Alex Lair-Larabie. Quarterback Quaid Johnson from the Cornwall Wildcats had some success and showed his talents, but in the end it was the West Defense that stopped up to stall most of the drives by the East.

The East Defense, while surrendering quite a few points still had a strong game, let by the exceptional play of Defensive Lineman Eli Krayem of the South Ottawa Mustangs. Krayem was a one-man wrecking crew for the East and dramatically limited the West's running game. Defensive Linemen Matt Cook, Mpamba Nzowa , and Grant Kauth-Gregory also had strong games for the East. LineBackers Shakiym Hoyte from the Cornwall Wildcats and Jeremy Salgo from the Cumberland Panthers both stood out for their play during the game.

East's MVP was Michael O'Connor, the Offensive Player of the Game was Quinton Soares and the Defensive Player of the Game was Eli Krayem.
